Special Note: Patrol had 3 violators from out of the area go to the Village of Mukwonago Police Department and post bond on citations issued.

- Labor Day – cold, windy and very quiet on the lake.
- 9/4/11 – arrest subject on open warrant with Oconomowoc Police Department.
- 9/10/11 – arrest subject on 4 open Town of Eagle Lake Patrol Warrants dating back to 2008. Subject detained and posted the \$402.00 amount due.
- 9/10, 11/11 Lake drawn down. We advised many boaters to use caution near islands and shoreline. Some knew about it and others did not. Report of 5 boats hitting stumps or shallow areas and damaging their props.
- 8/20/11 – A small airplane landed and took off on lake. Many boaters asked the Patrol if this was legal. It is legal for Waukesha lakes.

Complaints: 8/27/11

- Lake resident while skiing in ski channel was passed very closely by a white speed boat. Advised they should report problem right away while we could take action. They told the Patrol about it 3 hours later.
- Subject in a canoe reported a red and black speed boat with top board railing came so close to them as they crossed the lake that they almost capsized.

Paddle Boards: Several more paddle boards were spotted on the lake. Some have the “required” PFDs and a couple did not. We advised the parents of two 12-year-olds in Mary’s Bay they must have a PFD with them.

Special Patrol: On 3 very hot evenings we put out a 1 man patrol for a few hours to monitor the activity on the lake. This was due to requests to check for lake violators during times we are not normally working. No citations were issued.

Boat: Several attempts were made to get the “mobile” boat mechanic out to look at our boat while it is still in the water. One more try will be given. He needs to fix the linkage for the choke as the boat will not restart after being shut off.

Pull Boat: On Sunday 9/25/11, we will pull the boat, clean it well, and stow away all the equipment for the winter. We will drop it off behind the Town Hall so Tom can take it.

Summary: I will file a year-end report for the Board meeting in October.
